
## Candace Hicks' "Super String Theory" on view Nov. 14 through Dec. 6

Super String Theory, sometimes called the theory of everything, is science's attempt to understand the nature of the cosmos. For many people it calls to mind multiple universes and other paradigms that seem more like science fiction.

String Theory, a hand-embroidered artist's book in three volumes, investigates the workings of coincidence in the universe and posits these ideas as an independent version of the theory. What does it mean, for example, that 13 years before Harry Potter was published another series of children's books was written about an orphaned boy-wizard named Larry Potter? J. K. Rowling never read the books. She was sued by the author for plagiarism, but the print run was so small, it seems she was telling the truth.

It was just a coincidence, but it defies belief (especially considering that Larry Potter was also

surrounded by "muggles"). Sting Theory not only collects these coincidences, it offers an alternative model of the cosmos with coincidence as the key to natural law. Super String Theory is a larger collection of works on the subject of coincidence including all three volumes of String Theory, displayed together for the first time at Post-Studio Projects.
