ARTIST FAITH RINGGOLD TO OPEN NATIONAL AFRICAN AMERICAN QUILT CONVENTION WITH KEYNOTE AT SPENCER MUSEUM¹

LAWRENCE — Renowned artist Faith Ringgold will give the keynote lecture for the National African American Quilt Convention (NAAQC) at the Spencer Museum of Art at 6 p.m. July 11. Ringgold will discuss her life in art and activism in dialogue with University of Kansas Distinguished Professor Maryemma Graham at the event, which is free and open to the public.

"We are thrilled to welcome Faith Ringgold back to Lawrence," said Marla Jackson, organizer of the NAACQ. "Ringgold wanted to return here because she loved the community and she was impressed with the high level of presentation of the story guilts at the Spencer Museum last summer."

This is the second year for the NAAQC, which celebrates African-American history, quilting traditions and contemporary artistic practices. Registration² is required for NAAQC sessions held July 11-14 in

Lawrence and Topeka.

The Spencer Museum's current exhibition "Paying Homage: Celebrating the Diversity of Men in Quilts³" is organized in conjunction with the NAAQC. The exhibition focuses on contemporary quilts made by men with a theme of paying homage to ancestors or influential individuals. One of those individuals is Ringgold, whose groundbreaking "Flag Story Quilt" is included in the exhibition.

"It's a great privilege to honor the work and influence of Faith Ringgold through our exhibition," said Curator Susan Earle. "The men whose quilts are being shown pay homage to Ringgold's art, as well as the work of other powerful African-Americans, including Jimi Hendrix, Nelson Mandela and Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. We are delighted to have collaborated with Marla Jackson on the exhibition and Ringgold's visit."

The Spencer Museum will also host a gallery talk with artists William Daniels and Luke Haynes, who are featured in the exhibition, at 3 p.m. July 13. "Paying Homage" remains on view through Aug. 26.
