
## Graduate Curator's Insights into New Exhibition




Ph.D. candidate in History of Art and current Andrew W. Mellon Foundation/Loo Family Intern in European & American Art, Sara Stepp, curated the newly-opened special exhibition, *Past Presence*. Sara shares insights about the exhibition and what this opportunity means to her:

As a historian of art since 1960, I've been particularly drawn to the Spencer Museum's contemporary works since beginning my internship here. In thinking through some of the strengths of this collection, I noticed that many of the works engage with the past in poignant ways. I felt that putting them in conversation with one another could yield interesting insights into the ways that artists process memories and historical events. This thought process eventually led to *Past Presence*, now on view in the Kemper Family Foundations Balcony at the Spencer Museum.

This exhibition has been an incredible opportunity for me to strengthen my curating, research, and writing skills. I'm hoping to begin a career as a curator after I graduate. In working on this exhibition, I've learned how to work as a team, develop complementary programs, and how to create meaningful experiences through art for many different communities.

Our histories? *Past Presence* brings together works of art from around the world that interrogate the stories we tell about the past and the ways these narratives may shape our present realities.
