Lawrence, **KS**—This summer in the Central Court, the Spencer brings the outside – in. Organized by Kate Meyer, curatorial assistant in the department of prints & drawings, *Summer in the Central Court* will transform the walls of the museum's primary gathering space to showcase selections from the permanent collection related to the sights and activities common to summer.

Each corner of the court will be devoted to a different theme, visually dominated by one or two large-scale pieces. "Summer Gatherings" considers the social events, such as family reunions, picnics, and trips to the beach or the fair that fill our summer calendars and features Fairfield Porter's painting, *July*. "Summer Growth" examines the landscape of summer, particularly with its rural associations in this part of the country. Wheat harvest scenes and Lisa Grossman's *86 Bends of the Kaw* comprise this section. Tal Streeter's enormous Japanese-inspired kite, *Flying Red Line* presents one of several forms of "Summer Entertainment." The leaves, fruits, and blossoms of summer provide formal cues for Rose Kretsinger's *Paradise Garden* or *The Garden quilt*, and Christina Hays Malcom's *Sunflower quilt* in our section devoted to "Summer Patterns." Beat the heat and enjoy art inspired by summer at the Spencer!
