#### **FOREWORD**

That the arts of Costa Rica should be the subject of this exhibition is particularly appropriate in view of the long tradition of cooperation and exchange between the Universities of Kansas and Costa Rica. 1. St. Anthony of Padua, 18th Century Oil on cotton, 25 ½" x 19 ¾"

A beloved Spanish counter-reformation saint, St. Anthony was a favorite disciple of St. Francis and is frequently portrayed with the lily and a book. After the Renaissance, he was represented carrying the Christ Child.

A 15th century Spanish saint, St. Vincent is often depicted with a trumpet because he believed he was the instrument of God, announcing the Last Judgment.

Amighetti is especially well known for his woodcuts. A native Costa Rican, he prefers the small town and country themes of his province. He has traveled and studied in Mexico, South America, Europe and the United States. His work is most influenced by Mexican and European art. He opened the Amighetti gallery in 1967 and continues his work as artist, writer and professor of art history.

She is now a professor in the School of Fine Arts, University of Costa Rica. Ms. Fernandez has had one-man shows in Costa Rica, Panama, Columbia and Paris. She has exhibited in the United States and other countries in group shows.
