like' ness (lik' nes, -nis), n. 1. State or quality of being like. 2. Appearance; guise, semblance. 3. A copy; effigy; portrait.

Photography's ability to capture appearance, to record semblance, to portray, was apparent from the time of the medium's invention. "It's influence on the artist must be great," predicted Samuel F. B. Morse in April 1840. "By a simple and easily portable apparatus, he can now furnish his studio with fac-simile sketches of nature, landscapes, buildings, groups of figures, etc., . . . not, as heretofore, subjected to his imperfect sketchy translation into crayon or Indian ink drawings. . .but painted by nature's self with a minuteness of detail." The photograph's fidelity to nature was its most compelling aspect initially and caused some of Morse's artist colleagues to lament that from photography's invention, painting was dead. Painting, of course, survived this premature obituary. So, too, did photography survive, and flourish.

From its introduction in 1839 the photographic process altered our art, as prophesied by Morse, and our vision as well. From the outset it was intertwined with the long established art of portraiture. While "nature, landscapes [and] buildings" also caught the daguer-reotypist's eye, it was "groups of figures" or individual sitters which claimed his major attention during the early years of photographic practice. In time, the photographer's concerns ranged beyond the simple recording of likenesses to include a wide range of artistic and symbolic interpretations, ultimately achieving a variety of expression as great as the painter's.

Within this spectrum of artistic possibilities, the early concern for portraiture has continued strong. Any family photo album attests to the enduring appeal of the human subject, as do the portfolios of many major practitioners of the photographic art. At the Spencer Museum of Art portraits represent one of the strongest aspects of the photography collection, and the present exhibition and catalogue present a sampling of that rich resource.

While no attempt is made to present a definitive history of photographic portraiture, the exhibition does include many highlights of the genre, ranging from one of the earliest daguerrean portraits made in America to incisive character studies by such modern masters as Diane Arbus and Brassaï.

The works reproduced in this publication are primarily those new to the collection since the last publication on the Museum's photographic holdings, *The Language of Light* (1974). Selections also emphasize those images which have not been extensively published elsewhere. The exhibition was organized by Thomas Southall, Curator of Photography, with additional assistance from his graduate and undergraduate students in the Kress Foundation Department of Art History. Mr. Southall provides an overview of the developments in photographic portraiture in his introductory essay. Additionally seven key works have been singled out for more extended examination, demonstrating the different historical and critical problems attending specific portrait photographs, and further illuminating portrait work in general. Mr. Southall joins with me in extending thanks for their valued contributions to the student participants-Carolyn Barnes, Pamela S. Herrick, Lynn Lokensgard, Mary McCabe, Ronald K. Seeger and Donald D. Warring. We are also grateful for the generous assistance offered by colleagues here and elsewhere in the preparation of this exhibition, especially Ruth Lawner, designer of this publication, and Professor Lee Young of the University's School of Journalism, as well as William I. Homer, Ted Honig, Cecil Y. Lang, Jerald C. Maddox, Trudy Prescott and Douglas Tomsky.

The exhibition and catalogue have been made possible by contributions from the Spencer Museum's Corporate and Business Membership Program. These good neighbors from the area business community have been instrumental in maintaining the lively exhibition schedule and public programs of the Museum, and I extend my gratitude to them all for their generous and enlightened support.
